Special Needs Soccer Program

FEDS (Fergus Elora District Soccer) Our local **Special Needs Soccer program** is the only program in Ontario that gives our adult (16 – 60 year old) community members with developmental and/or physical disabilities the opportunity and environment where they feel comfortable as they are exposed to basic soccer skills, experience team play, social interaction, friendship, exercise and most importantly fun. The program is extremely successful and is a model for the rest of Ontario and Canada. We would like to use the funds from the Curl for a Cause drive to help us expand our program and share our success with those who wish to build programs similar to what we have in our community.



The Centre Wellington Food Bank assists over 370 families struggling to make ends meet in our community. We not only provide these families with food support but also with many other forms of support that help ease the stresses and strains they face on a daily basis . . . things like tax preparation, access to legal services, employment opportunities and most importantly we provide them with knowledge on how to gain access to other vital community services. We also help teach our members how to cook, provide young mothers with information about child nutrition and provide seniors with assistance in assessing governmental services . . . all this in a safe and welcoming environment without prejudice and judgement. In other words, we bring hope to people that often feel left out from the opportunities that many of us take for granted and hopefully we empower them to act.



KidsAbility is the recognized leader in Centre Wellington for empowering children and youth with a wide range of complex special needs. Last year, our passionate and dedicated team provided life-changing therapy (physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and speech & language therapy) and support services to 128 children and youth at our site on St. David Street in Fergus. Portage Ontario is committed to supporting vulnerable and marginalized youth (ages 14 to 18) overcome their substance dependency. Not only does our residential centre in Elora teach residents to stop using drugs, it helps youth build their self-esteem, develop a healthy lifestyle, and acquire new skills to succeed in school, at work, and plan for the future. Pledges in support of Portage will go to support approximately 50 youth from Centre Wellington who will seek out treatment at Portage in 2019.
